FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

The parish council, finance council, and board of education/faith formation need to review the handbook and the trustees are to sign a corporate resolution. 2. The original copy of the corporate resolution by US mail

Calendar Year-End Filing Requirements: As the end of the calendar year approaches, you are reminded of the following required annual filings:

- **Donations** – Provide donors with written confirmation for all contributions by January 31.
- **Payroll** – Furnish each employee a completed W-2 by January 31. File the W-3 transmittal form with the Social Security Administration by February 28.
- **Non-Payroll Payments** – Provide individuals or entities to whom you made payments of \$600 or more during the calendar year for services, rents, commissions, fees or other non-employee payments with Form 1099 by January 31. File copy A of each Form 1099 with the IRS by February 28.

A more complete description of these annual filings, along with instructions for reconciliation between the W-2s, W-3 and the quarterly Form 941 will be sent to the pastors and bookkeepers in mid-December. Las Posadas Project: Las Posadas means “the inns” or “the shelters” in Spanish. This is a religious and social celebration that takes place for nine nights, from December 16-24, and commemorates the journey of Joseph and Mary to Bethlehem and their search for shelter prior to the birth of Christ. The Las Posadas Project is a step in promoting Las Posadas and advocating for greater compassion towards immigrants. Ministry Formation Program (MFP):

The Ministry Formation Program is expanding to include a program for Spanish-speaking participants.

For the first time, during 2010-2011, we will offer the Basic two-year MFP in Spanish. Classes begin in January and will meet monthly on Sundays, 3:00-6:00 p.m., in St Joseph's Church basement in West Liberty. Class dates are January 10, February 21, March 21, April 11, May 2, June 13, July 11, August 8, and September 12. The next two-year program, 2012-2013, will be held in another location in the diocese. We hope to offer the program each year and move the location every two years.

We are grateful for the help of several priests, religious women, and lay ecclesial ministers who will teach the courses. The on-site facilitator is Matt McAndrew, who recently completed five years in ministry formation.

As needs in the Church and our diocese change, so does the formation program designed to form leaders for ministry in the Church. Since 1997, specialization programs have been added to the Basic two-year process for 1) catechetical leaders, 2) liturgical leaders, 3) pastoral associates, 4) finance administrators, and 5) parish life administrators. Year I in the Basic MFP is also a prerequisite for the diaconate.

El Programa de Formación del Ministerio ahora se ofrece en Español

El Programa de Formación del Ministerio se esta extendiendo para incluir un programa para participantes de habla hispana. Como un cambio en la Iglesia y en nuestra Diocesis, tambien el programa de formación designada a los líderes para el ministerio en la Iglesia. Desde 1997, programas adicionales se han agregado al proceso de dos años básicos. Los programas ahora incluyen un entrenamiento especializado para Líderes de Catequesis, Líderes de Liturgia, Socios Pastorales, Administradores de Finanzas y para la vida administrativa de la Iglesia. El año I básico de MFP también es un pre-requisito para ser diácono.

Por primera vez, ofreceremos el año II básico MFP en español. Las clases serán los Domingos por la tarde de 3:00 p.m. a 6:00 p.m. una vez por mes en el sótano la Iglesia de St. Joseph en la ciudad de West Liberty empezando en el mes de Enero. El programa se llevará a cabo en la ciudad de West Liberty por dos años 2010-2011. Los próximos dos años se llevaran a cabo en otra localidad de la diocesis durante el 2012-2013. Esperamos ofrecer el programa cada año y cambiarlo de localidad cada dos años a otra area de la Diocesis. Las clases serán en Enero 10, Febrero 21, Marzo 21, Abril 11, Mayo 2, Junio 13, Julio 11, Agosto 8, Septiembre 12.

Estamos muy agradecidos por la ayuda de varios sacerdotes, religiosas y ministros laicos eclesiasticos quienes ayudaran en los cursos en Español. Uno de los promotores es Matt McAndrew quien recientemente completo cinco años de Formación del Ministerio.
