Order of Celebrating Matrimony Workshops

Workshops to introduce the new *Order of Celebrating Matrimony* and present updates in marriage preparation in the diocese will be held in each deanery beginning in August. The workshops are intended for those who preside at weddings and/or are involved in ministry to couples preparing for marriage, such as priests, deacons (especially those who will not be able to make it to the deacons' fall convocation), coordinators and team members in marriage preparation programs, music ministers, and parish wedding coordinators.

Our schedule of dates and locations is as follows:

August 6 = Keokuk Deanery (Holy Family, Fort Madison)
August 27 = Iowa City (St. Patrick, IC)
Sept 3 = Ottumwa Deanery (St. Patrick, Ottumwa)

Nov 5 = Clinton Deanery (St. Joseph, DeWitt)
Dec 3 = Davenport Deanery (site TBA)

LITURGICAL CALENDAR

Feast of the Transfiguration

The Feast of the Transfiguration is celebrated on August 6 – which is also the anniversary of the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima, when nature itself was violently transfigured. Perhaps as we gather for Eucharist or pray the Hours this day we would do well to pray for peace and that the horrors of that August 6 seventy-one years ago will never be repeated.

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Solemnity of the Assumption, celebrated on August 15, falls on a Monday this year, and so is not a Holy Day of Obligation. When the obligation is abrogated, ritual Masses (i.e., marriage, confirmation) are still prohibited but funeral Masses may be celebrated. Marriage may be celebrated outside of Mass using texts from the Rite of Marriage. The liturgies of August 14-15 are celebrated as follows:

	Morning Prayer	Mass before 4pm	Mass after 4pm	Evening Prayer
Sunday, August 14	20 th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Week IV)	20 th Sunday in Ordinary Time	Vigil Mass: Assumption of the BVM	EP I of the Assumption of the BVM
Monday, August 15	Assumption of the BVM	Mass during the Day: Assumption of the BVM		EP II of the Assumption of the BVM

(N.B. If your parish is St. Mary of the Assumption, then the Solemnity can be moved to Sunday: the Saturday night Mass would be the Vigil of the Assumption and the Sunday Masses would be the Mass during the Day.)

One of the popular traditions associated with the Assumption is the Blessing of Fruits and Herbs (*Directory on Popular Piety*, #181). In the United States, the rite for use within or outside of Mass may be found in the *Book of Blessings*, ch. 59: “Order for the Blessing of Food or Drink or Other Elements Connected with Devotion.” A rite for use at home can also be found in *Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers* (1st ed. p. 170; 2nd edition p. 312).

Lent/Triduum 2017

Next year, *Ash Wednesday* falls on March 1.

We will celebrate the *Rite of Election* at Saint Patrick Church in Iowa City on Sunday, March 5 at 3pm (1st Sunday of Lent).

The *Chrism Mass* will be celebrated on Monday, April 3, at 5pm at Sacred Heart Cathedral.

The Triduum falls on Thursday, April 13 through Sunday, April 16 – with the *Easter Vigil* falling on the night of Saturday, April 15. On that night, the earliest that the Vigil may begin is 8:30pm.
